Key Race of the Day – Race 5 – Allowance (N2L) – About 1 Mile (Turf)

The Sunday feature is a very intriguing allowance race for non-winners of two races lifetime that is scheduled for the turf at about one mile. **#3 Go Go Alexander** is the morning-line favorite, who will race first off the claim for the Sharon Ceccato barn. This son of Souper Speedy has been quite consistent throughout his career and his numbers since transferring to the grass are not only his highest, but the highest in this field. He's been comfortable sitting a few lengths off the early action and has proven he can pass late. He was claimed for \$25k, so the expectations are high. Of the horses to race over this turf course, **#6 Sunset Skippy** came to life in his first turf start, winning by three-quarters of a length. That race was his second off the bench and last time out, he faced this level of competition, but in a dirt race and still ran quite well. Frankly, he was second best to Grand Warrior, who was able to lead throughout in that mile and seventy-yard event. Dirt may not be his preferred surface, but that race last time out likely sets him up nicely here, as he cuts back a tad today in distance while returning to the grass. **#1 Galileo Street** showed that he can go long on debut a month ago, winning in a big way, with a last to first move. Based on what we visually saw that day, the additional furlong should not hinder him at all. The one concern in this spot is the lack of speed on paper, as he'll likely be towards the back early on. Regardless, he is at least worth a long look in the exotics.
